

Generally, an army retreats as a result of losing the battle at hand or sometimes as a trick. Regardless of its use, the spiritual definition is of more importance to us. All year round there are marriage retreats, ladies' and men's retreats, teen retreats or the like.

Often, those times are great experiences to grow closer with other Christians but also to get away from the ever present bombardment of daily life. Many times we take such trips to a camp or cabin-like area. We shouldn't just associate a retreat with some group gathering in the woods. Instead, let us think of retreats also as what Merriam-Webster says "a place of privacy or safety".
