CAVE-IN

This past week I got the opportunity to visit part of Mammoth cave for the first time. I was unaware of the history the caves had with this country and the natives that lived before. Caves for thousands of years have offered a place for resources and shelter. I hope for more visits in the future but my time below ground has left me thinking

about caves. The word “cave” in English occurs forty times in the ESV. The majority of these are in the Old Testament but with that brings to my mind two passages.

1 Samuel 24:9-10 says “And David said to Saul, “Why do you listen to the words of men who say, ‘Behold, David seeks your harm’? Behold, this day your eyes have seen how the Lord gave you today into my hand in the cave. And some told me to kill you, but I spared you. I said, ‘I will not put out my hand against my lord, for he is the Lord's anointed.’”

1 Kings 18:3b-4 says, “Now Obadiah feared the Lord greatly, and when Jezebel cut off the prophets of the Lord, Obadiah took a hundred prophets and hid them by fifties in a cave and fed them with bread and water.”

The caves of En Gedi offered natural protection for David and his men but what happened in the cave for Saul was a moment of mercy. The prophets of the Lord that hid in caves could also find them as a place to seek refuge. David’s desire to be a respectful servant of the Lord God given Saul’s status as king and Obadiah’s courage and fear for the Lord bring an aspect of faithfulness and service to the cave events.

Maybe you associate caves with dark depths and creepy things, or as a place of adventure and fun. Let caves also be a reminder of many of the rich historical events that have occurred in years past. Remember the faithfulness of God’s servants and their fear of the Lord God Almighty. Whether you have gone down into caves or plan to stay away do not let them only be a place of natural phenomena. After all many of the caves that exist were shaped by God’s doing.
