## A Horrendous Tragedy

9/11 is a very significant date for Americans given the tragedy that occurred in 2001. Whether you remember where and what you were doing when it occurred or even in documentaries the situation is stomach churning. The

deaths, damage, and disregard for life ought to hurt for any reasonable person. As such, we as a country continue to pay our utmost respect for what happened.

Some sixty years earlier a tragedy of similar proportions occurred on December 7, 1941. What was then the worst attack we as a country sustained was the infamous attack on Pearl Harbor with almost all of those lost being in military service. The casualties of that day were only surpassed in 2001 when by and large civilians lost their lives. Sadly, there are many younger Americans who have forgotten Pearl Harbor and its date and many also are forgetting the events of 9/11.

How does all of this tie into Christians and us assembling today? While today is a significant date for Americans, there are a great deal of Christians assembling or already assembled on what is likely an ordinary Sunday. But that right there is the big deal and gives me two things to discuss.

The first is humanity's continual forgetfulness. Isaiah 17:10a says, "For you have forgotten the God of your salvation and have not remembered the Rock of your refuge" it would take a lot more space to list all the instances of deliverance and rescue the Lord provided for the nation of Israel. Yet, even so close to escaping the pursuit of pharaoh they grumbled and wanted to return to bondage. Forgetfulness was also a problem in the New Testament church! Galatians 1:6 says "I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel" *Continued* →
